



Message from the Senior Pastor

Dear Friends and Family of RRUMC,

When I first came to Rocky River United Methodist Church, one of the things that amazed me most was this church's generosity. It was not just that all of you were so generous, but that you had created a very vibrant culture of generosity within the church family. It was very apparent and widely understood and accepted as part of this church's DNA. That is not very common in most churches around the country. Most churches keep the talk of money quite secret and close to the vest. It is not something discussed openly or comfortably at any time in the church year, let alone the time of stewardship. For RRUMC, that is not the case.

Our Theo & Belle Moll Society is one of the most brightly shining examples of legacy giving within the East Ohio Conference of the United Methodist Church. Our culture of generosity was best made evident when Theo and Belle Moll gave the initial funds to get this endowment off the ground in the mid-1990s. Since then, that spirit has become contagious and more and more of our people continue to get caught up in it as it spreads throughout this amazing congregation.

The main purpose of these endowment funds is to defray some of the major costs that come along with running a building this size and all the ministries that take place within it and around it. By absorbing those major plant costs, the operating budget is able to function at full capacity, without having to redirect dollars to those plant costs. Since I have come to this church in July 2011, we have tackled some major plant upgrades and repairs. For example, we have completely renovated the church steeple. We have completely repayed the parking lot. We have put in two brand new boilers. Our church has put in a new chiller. The sanctuary and the hallway outside the chapel have had new carpeting installed. The exterior of the building has been repainted. All this does not Rev. Dan Bogre

include some of the less expensive projects that have been completed over the last ten years. In total, we have spent more than one million dollars in the last decade to address necessary church plant repairs and upgrades. It is because of the generosity of the people of this church, through the Theo & Belle Moll Society, that we have never had to divert money from the operating budget or conduct a capital campaign to keep our facility in tip top shape.

Obviously, 2020 was quite a year for everyone. It was also a very volatile year for the church's endowment funds. We watched the overall value drop substantially when COVID-19 hit in the first quarter of 2020. However, because of our Trustees, our Endowment Investment Committee, the wealth management company that handles our portfolio, and an incredible bounce back in the market as 2020 progressed, we were able to see our endowment funds not only regain its previous losses but grow substantially. I thank God for all those people who have joined the Theo & Belle Moll Society, as well as our Director of Endowment Ministries, Mrs. Lisa Sierk, who worked so tirelessly to engage new members of the Theo & Belle Moll Society.

Our mission and vision at RRUMC remains the same. "It's All About the Story. We exist to help people meet Jesus Christ in the midst of their story." I know that, because of the generosity of this congregation and the way it gets lived out through the Theo & Belle Moll Society, we will be able to accomplish and live into that vision for generations to come. I thank all of you from the bottom of my heart for all that you have done, are doing, and will do for many years to come to help that mission and vision live on for future generations.

Message from the Board of Trustees

We are grateful to everyone for your faith in Rocky River United Methodist Church and its mission and vision.

The year 2020 brought a deadly pandemic to the world, resulting in enormous economic losses everywhere. As trustees of Rocky River United Methodist Church, we were challenged in our stewardship role for the endowment funds. The volatility of the financial markets, particularly early in the pandemic, demanded that we be conservative in our decision-making regarding capital improvements.

We focused largely upon necessary maintenance of the church building, property and two parsonages. We also continued without interruption the church's commitment to provide college scholarships to church youth who demonstrated a strong engagement with their faith and with this church, and to support a United Methodist missionary in Africa.

Our decisions were guided by this church's mission and vision "to help people meet Jesus Christ in the midst of their story." Throughout it all, we were reminded always of the deep faith and commitment expressed for this church by Moll Society members over many decades. By also providing an annual perpetual tithe from Theo and Belle Moll to the church's operating budget, the endowment funds reflect an unwavering belief in this church and its role in the future.

This report highlights some of the projects that were made possible by the endowment funds. The largest task involved reinforcing portions of the building foundation on the Detroit Road side and repairing and enlarging the surrounding sidewalk areas. Inside, you may have noticed fresh paint in the church's stairwell, rotunda, gathering area and café. At the Riverwood parsonage, two windows were replaced, interior painting was done, and a fairly significant waterproofing project was completed — followed by new carpeting in the basement and some landscaping.

While necessary maintenance and upgrades might not be very dazzling, they are critical to maintaining the church's ability to function and to serve.

We are grateful to everyone for your faith in Rocky River United Methodist Church.

Fulfilling the Needs of Others

These funds allow us to meet a variety of needs in our church, community, and the world through both traditional and new outreach ministries. The ministries seek to help people meet Christ in the midst of their stories such as the support of an overseas missionary and higher education scholarships.

Apportionments

 Income used to supplement the current operating budget in any year the Church is unable to meet its Conference and District Apportionments

Benevolence

- Income used for causes that extend the outreach ministries of the church
- Can be used to augment non-annual major capital improvements and/or major repairs to the sanctuary organ

Capital Development

 Principal and income may be used to provide for major future changes to the church's property, including land and building improvements

Centennial

 Income used for improvement, maintenance, replacement, or repair of any property item believed to have a long-term useful life of more than ten years

Dean

Income used to support church programs

Education

 Income used for higher education scholarships awarded to members each year

Memorial

- All memorial funds given to the church that do not request a specific purpose are directed here
- Principal and income may be used
- Also used for altar flowers and special equipment and furnishings as needed

Trustee Discretionary

 Principal and income used to cover necessary projects as directed by the Board of Trustees

Music

Principal and income used to maintain and enhance the music program

Twice Blessed Free Store

 Principal and income used to provide for the ministries, capital expenses, and operation of the Twice Blessed Free Store campus






Spending by Category 2016-2020
