

REFLECTIONS ... by Rev. Daniel F. Bogre

Dear Friends and Family of RRUMC,

As you read this, we are now in the wake of the Easter Sunday celebrations, the spring break get aways, and hopefully some warm sunny weather will start to be the norm and not the exception. On the heels of our beautiful Holy Week and Easter Sunday



services, I am reminded once again of what a blessing it is to serve this wonderful congregation.

On July 1 of this year, I will begin my 13th year at RRUMC as your senior pastor. I feel like each year is better than the last. When I first came here, my boys were two and four years old and my wife and I had been married for seven years. Benjamin is now 17 and Alexander is now 15 and I have to look up to both of them. 




RED CROSS BLOOD DRIVE WEDNESDAY, APRIL 17






Books Recommended by Rev. Joy Fenton-Jones:



"Transforming Power: Biblical Strategies for Making a Difference in Your Community" by Robert Linthicum. Justice and power must be brought together, so that whatever is just may be powerful, and what-ever is powerful may be just"--Blaise Pascal. Christians must become proficient in the practice and exercise of power. Christians have often been wary of power, thinking of it as something inherently evil or oppressive. But God calls his people to wield power responsibly and to use it to promote his kingdom ideals of justice and peace. Linthicum's model of relational power provides practical strategies for changing individuals, communities, structures and systems. With insights from Biblical mentors and contemporary examples, this book offers hope to move toward the vision of the shalom community - God's intended best for communities and the world.

"Transforming Communities: How People Like you are Healing Their Neighborhood" by Sadjua Rani Jka. When there's so much conflict around the country and around the corner, what can one person do to make a difference? Here's the good news. Millions of everyday people are ready to step into their power to transform their communities. And you are one of them. Veteran community activist Sandhya Jha opens your eyes to the world-healing potential within you, and gives you the vision, the tools, and the encouragement to start transforming your neighborhood, one person at a time.





"Fierce Love: A Bold Path to Ferocious Courage and Rule-Breaking Kindness That Can Heal the World" by Dr. Jacqui Lewis. We are living in a world divided. But Rev. "Going Public: An Organizer's Guide to Citizen Action" by Michael Gecan. Michael Gecan has been a professional organizer with Industrial Areas Foundation, which has trained thousands of littleknown community groups from Brownsville, Texas, to Brownsville, Brooklyn.
