

2024 LENTEN STUDY SIGN-UPS

FEBRUARY 4, 11, & 18

Our all-church Lenten study, "In the Footsteps of the Savior" by Max Lucado will begin soon, with study groups

meeting various days and times. Our Lenten sermon series will also be based on this study. Sign-ups for study groups begin February 4 and continue through Feb 18. Books will also be available and cost \$17. This six-week study will take us to the places and introduce us to the people that shaped Jesus' life. Max Lucado will share key teachings and guide us through these places which include:

- Capernaum: where Jesus healed a woman with issues of blood and a synagogue leader's daughter.
- Sea of Galilee: where Jesus miraculously walked on water and calmed a storm.
- Mount of Beatitudes: where Jesus preached His famous "Sermon on the Mount."
- The Temple Steps: where Jesus proclaimed His authority.
- Garden Tomb: where Jesus defeated death and rose from the grave.
- Caesarea: where Peter discovered the salvation Jesus brought was for all people.

Plan to participate in this study whether through a study group or on your own. Time spent in this study of the Holy Land where Jesus walked and ministered will deepen your connection with the King of the Universe who became the Savior on the Cross.


SEND YOUR UPDATED INFORMATION BY SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 25!




REFLECTIONS ...

My family and I went to Niagara Falls between Christmas and New Years in December. First of all, I had no idea it was only three hours and twenty minutes away. We were there in no time. We spent our first night on the American side and the second two nights on the Canadian side. I was amazed at how




As I stood there for quite some time just watching the water go over the falls, I could not get over that it just keeps coming. I read one sign that said the actual amount of water going over the falls is around 50% of what it should be because of all the ways the Niagara River is tapped and dammed upstream. That is 50%? WOW! I started praying and thanking God for that incredible gift that He has given us in the beauty and power of Niagara Falls. The water reminded me of something. God's grace and blessings flow into our lives the same way. In John 1:16, it says, "From his fullness, we have all received grace upon grace." From God's fullness his grace never stops flowing into our lives. It is grace upon grace, like the waves rolling up on the shore or the water constantly rolling over the falls.

I invite you to imagine yourself standing under the falls of God's grace upon grace. Picture yourself being washed over and drenched in the grace that God has for you. 

THINGS TO CONSIDER FOR YOUR ESTATE PLAN

From late January until early April, we each spend some portion of our time collecting the necessary documents required for tax filings. While gathering these details, it is a suitable time to review and update beneficiary designations, to think about tax planning strategies for the coming year, including plans for charitable giving, and to consider updating or making estate plans.

Defining what you would like to accomplish and how your legacy will impact others takes careful thought and consideration. Here are some questions to consider for estate planning purposes as you are collecting and preparing your tax information:

- Who are your primary and contingent beneficiaries and how will assets be divided among them? When will the beneficiaries receive their inheritance?
- Do you have any specific bequests or do you wish that your bequests are used for specific purposes (such as education)?
- Are arrangements needed for the support of dependents?
- What charitable organizations, such as Rocky River United Methodist Church, have been important to you during your lifetime? How would you like to support them in your estate?

While this may seem like a lot to consider, please know that you are helping your family and heirs by having your financial matters in order and your wishes documented.

WATCHYOUR STEP!

The risk of slipping, tripping, and falling increases dramatically during winter months. To help you stay safe this season, we have put together 10 winter safety tips to prevent slips, trips, and falls:

Use special care when getting in and out of vehicles. Try to park your vehicle in a clear area and watch where you step as you get in or out.

Avoid carrying items that reduce your ability to see the ground in front of you. Whether it's one big item or five small ones, ask for help or take multiple trips so that you are never obstructing your sight.

Scan the path six or more feet ahead of you for trip hazards. Make sure your route ahead is clear of hazards such as rocks, clumps of snow, or a stray branch.

Walk slowly and take small steps. Walking slowly and taking small steps will help you maintain your balance.

Wear footwear that has slip-resistant soles. As the name indicates, slip-resistant soles lessen your chance of slipping on ice, snow, or water.

Plan ahead and give yourself sufficient time to get where you need to go. Whether walking or driving, leave your current location 5-10 minutes early in case roads and sidewalks are covered with snow and ice.

Keynote Speaker and Facilitator: Rev. Joy Fenton-Jones

Rev. Joy Fenton-Jones is an Authorized Minister in the United Church of Christ and a creative thinker about how congregations and their buildings may best serve the community. She serves two churches (DOC/UCC) in Cuyahoga Falls and devotes much time to navigating creative building reuse and church building redevelopment projects with congregations around Greater Cleveland and Akron.

Each one of us desires to make positive change. Whether in our personal lives, in our churches, or in the wider community, we want to leave circumstances better than we have found them. The biblical witness affirms this story: ordinary people, called by God, are catalysts for realizing God's Kin-dom right in their own neighborhoods. Using the tools of grassroots organizing, this seminar will make the case that with God's help and the partnership of our neighbors, we can participate in the transformation of our churches, our neighborhoods and the broader community. We will discover and practice the art of relational meetings; we will unearth the power of community listening; and we will develop a toolkit for breaking down seemingly intractable problems into manageable tasks. This seminar will draw on the work of Robert Linthicum's book, "Transforming Power: Biblical Strategies for Making a Difference in Your Community," and will also include the voices of interfaith community leaders and organizers from Cleveland and Cuyahoga County.
