Dear Friends and Family of RRUMC,

I wanted to take time in this article to celebrate a couple things that have happened recently in the church. There are many times that we are so busy working to help people meet Jesus Christ in the midst



of their story, like our mission and vision states, that we forget to celebrate it when we accomplish it. On May 21, we confirmed 15 youth of our church. It was an incredible Confirmation Sunday. The first thing to celebrate is the simple fact that we had it. There are many United Methodist churches that have not had a confirmation class in years. I want to celebrate our youth director, Steven Young, and the incredible work he did again this year to bring those youth along in their faith so that they could claim Christ for themselves. A big thank you to Michael Parry as well, who was Steven's right-hand man throughout the entire confirmation year. Those two worked tirelessly to bring those youth to a point where they could answer the most important question a person will ever answer in their life. That question is, "Do you confess Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, put your whole trust in his grace, and promise to serve him as your Lord, in union with the church which Christ has opened to people of all ages, nations, and races?" 




JUNETEENTH NATIONAL HOLIDAY - BOOKS TO READ


The following books related to the National Holiday Juneteenth have been donated to the church's Edith Wilson Library by the Cavicchi Christian Education Seminar.

Books for adults:




"The Half Has Never Been Told: Slavery and the Making of American Capitalism" by Edward E. Baptist. 2014.

The book reveals the alarming extent to which slavery shaped our country politically, morally, and most of all, economically. Until the Civil War, our chief form of innovation was slavery. Through forced migration and torture, slave owners extracted continual increases in efficiency from their slaves, giving the country a virtual monopoly on the production of cotton, a key raw material of the Industrial Revolution. The book offers not only a radical revision of the history of slavery but a disturbing new understanding of the origins of American power that compels listeners to reckon with the violence and subjugation at the root of American supremacy.



"Sweet Taste of Liberty: A True Story of Slavery and Restitution in America" by W. Caleb McDaniel, 2019 Henrietta Wood was born into slavery, but in 1848, she was taken to Cincinnati and legally freed. In 1855, however, a wealthy Kentucky businessman named Zebulon Ward, who colluded with Wood's employer, abducted Wood, and sold her back into bondage. She obtained her freedom a second time after the war and returned to Cincinnati, where she sued Ward for \$20,000 in damages--now known as reparations. In 1878, a Federal jury awarded her \$2,500.



"Stamped from the Beginning: The Definitive History of Racist Ideas in America" by Dr. Ibram X. Kendi, 2016

The 2016 National Book Award winning history of how racist ideas were created, spread, and deeply rooted in American society. Kendi chronicles the entire story of anti-black racist ideas and their staggering power over the course of American history. He uses the life stories of five major American intellectuals to drive this history: Puritan minister Cotton Mather, Thomas Jefferson, abolitionist William Lloyd Garrison, W.E.B. Du Bois, and legendary activist Angela Davis. As Kendi shows, racist ideas did not arise from ignorance or hatred. They were created to justify and rationalize deeply entrenched discriminatory policies and the nation's racial inequities.



"On Juneteenth" by Annette Gordon-Reed, 2021

The essential, sweeping story of Juneteenth's integral importance to American history, as told by a Pulitzer Prize—winning historian and Texas native. Weaving together American history, dramatic family chronicle, and searing episodes of memoir, Annette Gordon-Reed's On Juneteenth provides a historian's view of the country's long road to Juneteenth, recounting both its origins in Texas and the enormous hardships that African-Americans have endured in the century since, from Reconstruction through Jim Crow and beyond.

Books for Kids and Teenagers:



"All Different Now: Juneteenth, the First Day of Freedom" by Angela Johnson, illustrated by E. B. Lewis, 2014

Through the eyes of one little girl, All Different Now tells the story of the first Juneteenth, the day freedom finally came to the last of the slaves in the South. Since then, the observance of June 19 as African American Emancipation Day has spread across the United States and beyond. This stunning picture book includes notes from the author and illustrator, a timeline of important dates, and a glossary of relevant terms.



"Juneteenth for Mazie" written and illustrated by Floyd Cooper, 2015

Little Mazie wants the freedom to stay up late, but her father explains what freedom really means in the story of Juneteenth, and how her ancestors celebrated their true freedom.


"The Story of Juneteenth: An Interactive History Adventure" by Steven Otfinoski, 2015

The Emancipation Proclamation and the Civil War have brought an official end to slavery, yet some Southern slave owners are refusing to comply. The road to freedom is still long and hard for many African Americans, but you're not giving up. Will you: Overcome obstacles as you make your way north from Texas, looking to begin a new life of freedom? Seek out your family, from whom you were separated as a child, after emancipation? Fight back when you take work as an apprentice but find that you're still treated as a slave? YOU CHOOSE offers multiple perspectives on history, supporting Common Core reading standards and

providing readers a front-row seat to the past.




"Juneteenth Jamboree" by Carole Boston Weatherford, illustrated by Yvonne Buchanan, 2017
Joining her parents in a community celebration of Juneteenth, Cassie learns about the day when slaves in
Texas were freed some two years after the Emancipation Proclamation and wonders why the news took so long to reach them.



"Freedom Over Me: Eleven Slaves, Their Lives and Dreams Brought to Life" by Ashley Bryan, 2016 Using original slave auction and plantation estate documents, Ashley Bryan offers a moving and powerful picture book that contrasts the monetary value of a person with the priceless value of life experiences and dreams that a slave owner could never take away.

Books for Teens and Adults:



"Stamped: Racism, Antiracism, and You: A Remix of the National Book Award-winning Stamped from the Beginning" by Jason Reynolds and Ibram X. Kendl, 2021

The construct of race has always been used to gain and keep power, to create dynamics that separate and silence. This remarkable reimagining of Dr. Ibram X. Kendi's National Book Award-winning "Stamped from the Beginning" reveals the history of racist ideas in America, and inspires hope for an antiracist future. It takes you on a race journey from then to now, shows you why we feel how we feel, and why the poison of racism lingers. It also proves that while racist ideas have always been easy to fabricate and distribute, they can also be discredited.
