REFLECTIONS ...

Dear Friends and Family of RRUMC,

There is no doubt that one of the greatest blessings in my ministry so far has been the ability to lead three different groups to the Holy Land. Many of us remember the stories from our Sunday School classes when we were children about those amazing places in the Bible. We remember hearing about Bethlehem, Nazareth, Jericho, the Sea of Galilee, Jerusalem, the Temple, and the wilderness. As a child, I remember trying to imagine what they must have looked like and what it must have been like to be there. For the longest time all of the places, "over there," seemed like just that, places over there. As a child, you are thinking that they are just wonderful stories from a story book. We then grow up and realize that those are real places and your mind quickly gives way to your imagination as to what those places really look like and more importantly, what they feel like if you're there.



I want to formally invite all of you to join me for my fourth trip to Israel. We will be traveling to the Holy Land in January of 2020. The main trip will be from January 7-16. We will stay in

Bethlehem for a couple of nights and have dinner with a local Palestinian Christian family there. We will see Caesarea Philippi, Nazareth, Capernaum, Church of the Holy Sepulcher, Church of the Nativity, and sail on the Sea of Galilee along with seeing many other fascinating spots in and around Jerusalem. I have led three different groups totaling well over 60 people and each and every person has told me that the trip to the Holy Land changed their lives and the way that they read the Bible. It is a trip filled with some of the most powerful spiritual moments that you will ever have in your life. Tears always flow when we sail on the Sea of Galilee and when we sing Christmas carols in the Church of the Nativity. The silence is deafening when we take communion at the Garden Tomb in Jerusalem.

The cost is only \$2,898 from Cleveland to Israel and back again. That includes everything besides your lunches and any souvenirs that you might want to purchase. There are also four extensions that are being offered. Each of them have additional costs but the opportunities are amazing. They are four days in Egypt, five days in Egypt with a Nile River cruise, three days in Jerusalem on your own, or three days in Jordan. I know that is a lot of money but I hope you will prayerfully consider this once in a lifetime opportunity. You will be changed and you will never ever read the Bible the same way. Come and be a part of something amazing.

Results of Health Ministry Survey

Looking forward to the peace of June with warm breezes and joy of time with friends and family? While you are resting, the Health Ministry Team (HMT) will be planning new activities. In April, 77 of you responded to the HMT Survey (27 men and 49 women). Using the information you provided, we are planning a walk in the Metroparks, and nutrition and Medicare programs. Mental health concerns focused around anxiety and dementia will be addressed. The full survey results with colorful graphs can be found on the Health Ministry bulletin board in the Sanctuary narthex. Below is a brief summary of each question. The top four health education programs you would participate in are health finances (33), dementia (29), and diseases and pharmaceutical updates (21 each). The top three health promotion topics were nutrition (47), exercise (38), and sleep (35). The top topics to expand our tool box to understand and support those with mental health concerns are anxiety and mental health (each with 35), relating to someone experiencing the challenges of dementia (32), and understanding the difference between normal and abnormal mental health (22). The HMT would like to expand our activities by offering exercise opportunities and perhaps combining them with an additional talk. This idea seems to be of interest to many. A one to two hour walk in the Metroparks would be of interest to 46 responders and 24 each for intergenerational Christian yoga and a one to two hour bike hike in the Metroparks. Several of you responded with additional suggestions including various forms of yoga and an ongoing walking group. We will be going back to the data to determine which age group prefers which time for programming. The favorite time for activity was Wednesday evening. The top choice for morning was Thursday and the top afternoon was Sunday. Responders by age groups were age 61-70 (22 responses), age 71-80 (17 responses), age 41-50 (13 responses), age 51-60 (11 responses), age 80+ (8 responses), age 31-40 (4 responses), and age 21-30 (1 response). Thank you to all survey responders!



