At its March 19 meeting, the RRUMC Administrative Council formed a "Way Forward Planning Team" comprised of RRUMC's Lay Leader (Phil Ardussi), Staff-Parish Relations Chair (Sally Lenhart), Finance Chair (Tom Dewey), Trustees Representative (Cindy Schafer), and Ad Council Chair (Bill Cowles), who will meet on a scheduled basis for a minimum of one year to accomplish four specific objectives:

- Monitor the future outcomes and actions of the United Methodist Church related to its adoption and inclusion of the Modified Traditional Plan in the Book of Discipline.
- Provide discussion and listening opportunities to church members and constituents about the implementation effects of the Modified Traditional Plan at RRUMC.
- Report results of monitoring, discussion, and listening to the Administrative Council on a monthly basis.
- Recommend specific policies, practices, and programs that may need to be implemented.

#### Ten warning signs of good health



"10 Warning Signs of Good Health


- 1. Persistent sense of humor.






